BISHOP'S MESSAGE FOR NOVEMBER 2016

I thank all the Parish Priests and the Chaplains to have organized well the Mission Sunday on 16 October. This has been a strong reminder to our people to pray for the missions and make sacrifices by contributing generously towards mission activities of the church. A very few priests ask how this money is spent. The money collected for the missions is sent to the National Director of Pontifical Mission Society in Bangalore. He in turn sends the money to the Holy See which disposes the money according to the need of the missions. When churches, priests' residences, schools, institutions are being built, we too had made an application to the Holy See to help our projects. Almost all our applications have been responded favourably by giving us some contribution for our works. In fact we have received more than we have contributed to the Holy See. There have been a publication in the media that this money is spent for converting people and mission Sunday is considered as a conversion Sunday. We are sorry for the publisher disseminating wrong ideas and misleading the vulnerable. We know the teachings of the Church of spreading the good news to all people as per the mandate of our Lord. We have a fundamental right to practice and propagate our religion which is enshrined in the Indian Constitution. To complement this work we do carry on the humanizing works through various activities for the people specially in the mission countries. The Church in Mangalore has been actively involved in the spread of the Gospel both among the baptised and non-baptised. Our missionaries have spent themselves in places wherever they landed in and out of India. At present we have the **Same** mission. Let us continue to pray for the mission work and evangelisation. Let us not be taken up by gossip against the missionary activities of the Church.

I will be celebrating the Golden Jubilee of my Priesthood on 3 December. I will be offering a thanksgiving mass at the Cathedral on that day at 9 a.m. I cordially invite every one of you to join me in the Mass. While thanking the Lord for the good health and perseverance in my vocation as a priest and later as a Bishop for the past 50 years, I am grateful to all the priests, religious and the lay faithful of this Diocese for their wonderful cooperation and prayers. I wish to have this celebration in a

modest manner excluding external pomp and grandeur. Please consider this as my personal invitation to all of you. After the mass the refreshments will be served.

Our Diocesan shrine at Mudipu will celebrate the annual feast on 1, 2 and 3 December. The announcement in the Raknno and Internos is already done. Please announce this to your faithful and encourage them to attend the feast in any one of the day. St Juze Vas had been a missionary to our Diocese and he served in this Diocese for 4 years. Surely he remembers us before God. Let us honour him and pray for his assistance.

Circular

In the previous meetings of the Council of Priests and the Diocesan Pastoral Parishad, I had called for proposals to amend the existing Diocesan Pastoral Constitution. This was made known to all the clergy through Internos. A few suggestions and proposals for amendment have been sent to the Secretary of the Senate.

I had appointed a committee to go through the proposals for amendments and the committee was pleased to prepare a draft of the same and forwarded to me. The committee consisted the following:

The contents of this circular should be made known to the faithful a couple of times. I invoke God's blessings upon all.

This Decree is given on 1 November 2016, on the Feast of All Saints, from our Episcopal Residence at Kodialbail, in the twenty first year of our episcopate and 50 year of our priesthood in the year of the Lord during the special Jubilee of Mercy to all the Diocesan Clergy, Religious and lay faithful.

Inter Religious Dialogue: Liturgical Practices

Since Catholic liturgy is meant for Catholics, strictly speaking it has no opening for other religions. However, we live in a country where people belonging to other faiths are invited or voluntarily participate in our liturgy. Hence, the issue of inter religious worship becomes a delicate matter. We are happy and we want people of other faiths to participate in our worship, especially at feasts. But we will have faith issues to participate in the worship of other faiths since we do not share the same idea of God and faith. As we are into inter religious dialogue in recent years, the question needs clarification so that we do not sacrifice our faith and scandalize those who are weak in faith (1 Cor 8, 4-13).

1. Changed Prospective

Prior to Vatican II, we were sure that we had nothing to do with other religions and their worship. It was simply forbidden. But now with the changed prospective at Vatican II, we have new questions. Vatican II has taught us to respect what is true and good in other religions (LG 15) However, we have to pay attention to what members of those religions believe and how they pray. Since not all of them pray in the same way or even for the same reasons, true respect requires us to recognize the distinctiveness of each religion and to be aware of our deeply

held differences, including our Catholic beliefs in Jesus Christ, the Redeemer of the world, and in the Church as the sign and instrument of God's communion with humanity. We should keep in mind that ecumenical prayer, which involves Christians is different from persons of other religions..

2. Liturgy is meant for Catholics, not for Others

Our liturgy is exclusively meant for us. Liturgy is the official celebration of the Church (SC 26). It is a voice of the bride addressed to his bridegroom (SC 84). Hence, only Catholics can be participants at liturgy, not others, not even other Christians belonging to various churches or denominations. Therefore, we may not invite people of other faiths to liturgy. If one is to be invited for a wedding, not for Mass, but for the reception. If they come of their own will, then do not prohibit them, but we must be clear that they cannot perform any liturgical role like proclaiming the word of God, reading the prayers of the faithful or singing in the choir. We need to be careful as regards the school Masses, lest we mix up things with good intentions. Besides, the people of other faiths may not follow the liturgical language, it may not be proper to encourage them to be at the liturgy.

3. People of Other faiths and Popular Devotions

Our feasts attract many people of other faiths to our Churches. Most them will pay a visit to the Church or to the statue. Well, they are free to express their devotions. In recent years we have introduced some customs to satisfy their religious thirst, perhaps in the name of PRASADA, giving them Holy water and flowers. Since the holy water is a reminder of baptism for Catholics, I do not see any meaning to that practice. Giving flowers too, I do not think has any meaning from Hindu tradition (since flowers are not given by a *Pujari* to the devotees in a Hindu temple), much less from a Christian sense! Then, what shall we give them? perhaps a picture of Jesus with a prayer or a biblical verse?

4. How do we participate at a non-Christian worship?

We believe in one God, triune God. But the God(s) they believe in and worship should tell us clearly that we cannot participate in their worship. Polytheism, idolatry is against Christian faith (CCC 2112, 2113). Therefore, participating in their worship directly by offerings (flowers, fruits) or by adoration to the statue

(bowing, bowing)), is against the First commandment (CCC 2087-2089). However, visiting a worship place and greeting them on the occasion of feasts, is in order.

- **5. Should people of different religions pray together?** Many people today will respond quickly: After all, there is only one God, and our differing concepts about the one God shouldn't prevent us from praying together."
- a) Are there obstacles to interreligious prayer? The chief obstacle is that people of different religions do not agree on how to pray, why we pray, or what words to use in prayer. Each religion has a distinct understanding of the sources of prayer and of the meaning of words it considers to be inspired by some religions, such as Buddhism or Jainism, do not recognize the need to pray to a Supreme Being of any kind, so it would make little sense to invite them to pray the Our Father, a biblical psalm, a verse of the Qur'an, or a passage from the ancient Vedic hymns. True respect means allowing each tradition to express itself in accordance with its own art forms, beliefs, and words, and for its own reasons.
- b) What is distinctive about Christian prayer? As Catholics, we are aware that prayer is a unique gift of the Holy Spirit to those who believe in Jesus as Lord and Savior. The Christian who has received the Holy Spirit prays in union with Jesus and so glorifies God the Father (Rom 8:26). Christian prayer can be formal and liturgical, personal and vocal, or silent and contemplative, but it always arises from Christ's gift of the Holy Spirit. All forms of Christian prayer testify to the unique gift of grace that comes to those who believe in Christ, the unique Word of God. For this reason, it would be inappropriate to invite those who do not believe in God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit to pray Christian prayers.
- c) Is interreligious prayer to be encouraged? Even if it is not advisable for Christians and persons of other religions to pray together using the same words and gestures, we should welcome opportunities to pray in the presence of those who belong to other world religions. Pope Benedict XVI encouraged this kind of prayer on special occasions when he said, Interreligious prayer services during the national feast of Thanksgiving. Since they provide a stage for the members of different religions to come

together and enhance mutual understanding and promote the common good, they are helpful (Interreligious Gathering at the Pope John Paul II Cultural Center, Washington, D.C., April 17, 2008). Such events are most effective when planned by religious persons who serve the local community together. It may be particularly appropriate, in the context of dialogues about spirituality, to share times of quiet meditation or contemplative prayer with people of other religions who value silence.

- d) What should be considered when planning an interreligious event? Interreligious ceremonies should respect the traditions of all those who participate in them. Members of all the religious groups involved should be engaged in the planning process and agree on the final details; otherwise it would be a service planned by one or more groups with others invited as guests. Each group should present proposals for separate moments of prayer, meditation, or reflection. Careful attention should be given to any prayers that refer to other traditions, whether their representatives are present or not. Any proselytizing or negative stereotyping of another group must be avoided. Prayers and readings can mention key positive beliefs of the traditions present. These will provide valuable insights into the worldviews of the various traditions present. Catholics may wish to mention Jesus as Son of God or the Virgin Mary as intercessor, for example, and Jews, Christians, and Muslims may all profess the unity of God. Planners would do well to ask local religious leaders to review proposed prayers and plans in order to avoid partisan references. It is not advisable to invite everyone to participate in ritual gestures that may be alien to some of those present. For example, periods of silence or the use of music are integral parts of prayer for many religious communities, but not for all.
- 6. What about the preparation of the worship environment and order of service? Planners need to be attentive to the presence of symbolic objects when choosing the house of worship in which the event is to be held, especially if members of traditions that avoid images or statues will be present. Since many religions consider the treatment, handling, and position of sacred books or scrolls to be of the greatest importance, only those authorized to handle scriptures should do so. Given the sensitivities involved, persons who have changed religious affiliation are normally not asked to lead interreligious prayer events or dialogues that involve the community with which they were previously affiliated.

7. What should be done to prepare those who will be attending the event? Once the program has been agreed upon, members of the participating congregations will need to be informed beforehand about dress requirements such as head coverings, shawls, or removal of shoes. A printed order of service is most helpful, because the content and sequence of the celebration will be unfamiliar to some in attendance. Translations of prayers in other languages should be provided. Participants should also be informed if there will be a reception after the event and if provision has been made to honor the dietary regulations of the communities represented. Foods should be clearly labeled to show their contents. Conclusion Planning with and praying in the presence of other believers should strengthen mutual respect and cooperation. Interreligious prayer involving representatives of different religious traditions, just like ecumenical prayer among Christian believers, will show the power of reconciliation and peaceful cooperation among religions in service to the common good of humanity. Interreligious relations are a valuable "sign of the times" in which Catholics are invited to participate. Catholic pastors and laity who are called upon to plan interreligious events need to be people of prayer who are well informed in these matters. Catholics who participate in interreligious prayer, following the guidance of the Holy Spirit and the teachings of the Church, discover new aspects of their life in Christ and deepen their own faith as they engage those on other spiritual paths. Whenever possible, the Catholic portion of an interreligious prayer event should make use of approved liturgical resources.

Conclusion

Inter religious dialogue consists in creating good will and promoting harmony among religions. But sharing worship presupposes that we believe in the same God and is doctrinally conformed. Therefore, until then, we come together as human persons and understand each other and work for common good.

Celebration of Marriages in Advent

- 1. Advent is a joyful time to wait on the Lord, therefore, in this season marriages are not forbidden, including on days from Dec 17-24 (cf Ordo, page 16 & 22).
- 2. If a marriage has to take place on any Sunday in Advent season (at Parish Mass or outside the scheduled Masses), the Mass of proper Sunday is celebrated with purple vestment, reciting the creed, prayers of the faithful of Sunday with a prayer to the spouses, the proper readings of Sunday, however without the *Gloria*. Since the Liturgy of the Word of God is of great importance at Mass, one of the readings (either the First or the Second), may be used from the proper readings provided for marriage in the Lectionary (The Rite of Matrimony, 34, see Ordo page 22).
- 3. If a marriage has to be celebrated on any days of the week in Advent season, except on December 8 - Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, marriage Mass is celebrated with its proper readings in white or festive vestments, however without the Gloria since the season of Advent does not call for it.
- 4. Since the season of Advent does not anticipate the joy of Christmas, decoration or arrangements of flowers and music must be moderate (Cf Ceremonial of Bishops, 236, The Rite of Marriage 32, Ordo, Advent season, on page 35).

It was released by Oswald Cardinal Gracias, the President of the CCBI and FABC during the 75 Executive Committee Meeting of the CCBI, on 20 September 2016 at St John's National Academy of Health Sciences, Bangalore.
