#### **BISHOP'S MESSAGE FOR FEBRUARY 2018**

I hope the announcements are made in all the churches and chapels in our Diocese that the year 2018 has been declared as the year of the Rosary of Blessed Virgin Mary. In the context of the 450 years of Christian presence in Rosario parish by erecting a chapel the first one in this Diocese, dedicated to Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary by the Portuguese in a place called Bengare, the year 2018 is declared as the year of the Family Rosary. I wish that every family revives the devotion of daily family rosary. Many suggestions are given to you to popularize this devotion in this year.

We will be celebrating the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes on 11 February. Being a Sunday, the Sunday liturgy is to be followed. However you may have the devotion to Our Lady of Lourdes by the candlelit procession and rosary as it is done in many parishes. This day was also observed as a day of the sick by St John Paul II. The reason being, on the feast day and other days of the year many sick people visit the Shrine at Lourdes and pray for good health. Let us have special prayers for the sick on 11 February. Let us also remember various institutions in our Diocese giving service to the sick and abandoned by the families and the society. We should thank them for such service they do to the people who are not kith and kin to them but brothers and sisters of Jesus Christ. Jesus has said as long you have done to the least of my brothers and sisters you have done it unto me (Mt.25:40).

The 14 February is the Ash Wednesday. It is a day of penance for the whole Church of Roman Rite to be marked by fasting and abstinence. The Lenten season is a time of preparation for the celebration of Easter. In early Church the baptism to the new converts was done on the Easter vigil. For this, there was a preparation for the catechumens at various stages of Christian initiation. This season prepares the faithful to recall their baptism and do penance to change their sinful life to a life of holiness. The adults from the age of 18 shall

observe the fast and abstinence. Whereas, the others when they reached the age of 14 observe the abstinence. During the Lenten season let us initiate the children in the family to give up certain entertainments in the spirit of penance. During the season many holy practices are done by the faithful and priests and religious as well. We conduct the way of the cross, voluntary fasting and prayer. The faithful also go on pilgrimages and spend a day in recollection and make their confession and participate in the mass. The priests who are incharge of the Shrines should welcome the pilgrims and make good preparation to accommodate them and have a meaningful celebration of mass. Many of our faithful attend daily mass in the mornings, give up entertainments, give up the usual habit of taking alcohol, not keeping any entertainment etc. in the season of Lent. All these practices help us to change our life to return to God our heavenly Father who waits for us to shower His mercy and love on us. Those who have birthdays in lent, may kindly postpone the festive celebration, for the people are scandalized at those celebrations, when actually the lay people do not celebrate during lent. story of the prodigal son and the lost sheep is to be repeated in our life. It is not so much the reparation of our sins but efforts we make to return to the Father, never to go back into our own profane habits. The mercy and love of God cannot be measured by us or by our penance and any kind of reparation. This is the time for us to meditate and live on the immense love and mercy of God. During this season in some places there are public way of the cross devotion, such as in Pezar, Mudipu and some other parishes. The pastors are requested to exhort the people to attend these devotions in big numbers. Our whole effort is to keep our faithful in the holiness of life when the world and consumeristic society drags them downwards.

The pastors are requested not to leave the parishes during the season of Lent and advent. The faithful require the presence of priests in their parishes for various exercises befitting the Lenten observance. We have a good custom to keep a day for confession in every parish and all the deanery priests cooperate with the parish priest to render service in the parishes. Let us continue it in a very meaningful way without rushing through the entire exercise. On the whole, let us respond to the call of God for a profound change in opening ourselves to the Kingdom of God and permitting it to determine the direction of our life. The other part of our response should be that we believe in the Gospel, and we take Jesus at His word – That what sounds too good to be true is really true. Let us acknowledge there is evil in the world and in us. We have sinned in what we have done and in what we have failed to do in; our thoughts, in our words and in our actions. Let us accept lent as a time of testing our attitudes, values, concerns and life goals - testing not with a view to pass/fail but to improve ourselves. Let us move on to direct our prayers and actions outward to the glory of God and the needs of our human community.

I request everyone to get into the spirit of Lent and to meditate on the love and mercy of God our Father. Let us pray for one another and let us gather ourselves at the end of the day for a family rosary which binds us together. Please continue to pray for me. May God bless you and keep you in His love.

#### YEAR OF THE ROSARY - 2018

The following suggestions and guidelines to make the Year of Rosary - 2018 a meaningful and spiritually profitable one.

- VISION: May Mary Mother of the Most Holy Rosary bless India.
- **II. MISSION:** All families take up the devotion to Rosary through family prayer, meditating on the mysteries of Jesus and offer it for the peace and unity of all Indians of different religions, caste and creed.

#### III. AIMS:

- 1) The Republic of India should become more and more strong, meaningful and safeguard the Constitution of India where all have equal opportunities.
- 2) The various Governments in states may promote the rights of God and humans and render justice to the people for which all of us should work.
- 3) The unity and charity in families, parishes and in the Diocese among the people to be fostered and progressed.
- 4) The married couples may safeguard the holiness of their vocation.
- 5) The priests and the religious may live according to their calling and live an exemplary life to the flock entrusted to their care.
- 6) All baptized may receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and use them appropriately.

#### IV. OUR EFFORTS TO ACHIEVE:

- 1) the religious leaders and pastors to promote the recitation of daily rosary.
- 2) the pastors to inspire the families in the parish that to begin their day with a decade of rosary, recite it whenever time permits and to live a faithful life and love as Mary lived.
- 3) in the entire diocese to popularize the rosary devotion.
- 4) in every parish a day to be celebrated as a Rosary day.
- 5) the pastors give a homily explaining the importance of every Marian feast during the year.
- 6) small drama, hymns and quiz etc. to be promoted among the people

- 7) pilgrimages to Marian shrines
- 8) more attention to girl child and girls and women
- 9) before every mass our spiritual exercise in the church, a recitation of the 5 decades of rosary to be prayed
- 10) to display banners on Rosary prayer in important places of the parish.

#### A. Personal efforts:

- 1) keep the rosary in your purse, pocket, vehicle and wear it around the neck.
- 2) Start the day with one decade of rosary
- 3) give a rosary gift to your friends or on the prize distribution day in the parish.

#### B. In the family:

- 1) daily family rosary
- 2) to take the patrons (Mary's) image from family to family.
- 3) in the priests and religious communities and where lay people are gathered recite the rosary for vocations to the priesthood and religious life

#### C. In the wards:

- 1) the neighbouring 3-4 houses could come together and recite the rosary.
- 2) to recite rosary or decades before the ward meetings
- 3) to organize competitions on Marian hymns.

#### D. Parish level:

- 1) organise quiz or composition competition
- 2) small dramas, reading rosary
- 3) to recite the 20 decades rosary
- 4) to establish the rosary confraternity
- 5) in emergent situation to recite at least one decade of rosary
- 6) to recite rosary during the procession or to organise competition of Marian hymns.
- 7) to start legion or Marian sodality where it doesn't exist
- 8) to recite rosary during religious processions
- 9) to give a homily on the titles of Mary in the litany of Mary.
- 10) to give gifts of rosary on the occasions
- 11) to start with a decade of rosary before any spiritual exercise.
- 12) to recite rosary in the family and also when the dead body is carried to the cemetery

#### E. Deanery level:

- 1) organise quiz on Marian hymns
- 2) quiz and composition
- 3) to study on Papal teachings on Mary
- 4) to organize a Marian gathering once a month
- 5) a training on Marian cult

#### F. Diocesan Level:

- to organize on TV channel of Divine Word the Angelus and Rosary in the morning and evening
- 2) to translate the Apostolic letter on Rosary by St John Paul II in Konkani.
- 3) publications on Mary and Rosary
- 4) to organise get together of Religions
- 5) Rosary exhibition
- 6) competition of Marian hymns
- 7) in October homilies on Mary and Rosary
- 8) publication of articles in the parish bulletins and other print media
- 9) a workshop on Mary for peace ongoing programme
- 10) art and literature to organize an exhibition and seminar
- 11) to keep up the Marian month May and October
- 12) to organize a diocesan gathering as a conclusion of the Rosary Year

#### MISSIONARY CHILDHOOD IN OUR COMMUNITY

#### **Background**

The figure of the child has always had an irresistible and undeniable influence on everyone's heart: his/her simplicity, beauty and sparkling vitality seems a reflection of God's life. Also Jesus Christ, who with His birth in the stable at Bethlehem and his infancy in Egypt and Nazareth knew that state of loving bliss, was particularly fond of children: Let the children come to me and do not hinder them: for to such belongs the kingdom of God (Lk 18:16).

#### Introduction

Year 2018 is the 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the Pontifical Society of the Missionary Childhood. We are happy to share the wonderful reality of the Pontifical Society of the Missionary childhood or Holy Childhood, in order to know and take advantage of it more in our own communities. Through Bishops, missionaries, animators and children, God is helping children to achieve evangelizing wonders in their families, with other children and for the sake of universal evangelization. We also observe with immense gratitude that this Society is a special path for children's Christian and Missionary maturation. Each parish, each Diocese and the universe church can feel that this Society of Missionary childhood is its own.

The focal point of this Society is the particular role that 'children have in the proclamation of the Kingdom. In fact they are particularly suited to accepting it and living the riches of its beauty, joy and love. Then in the Christian language 'smallness' is a fascinating spiritual category that reflects God's holiness. Devotion to the Child Jesus is perceived as man's obedience; abandonment to the father's will and it is classified in states of life as spiritual childhood.

# A brief history of the holy childhood association i. Origin

The great missionary movement, which was born in France in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century, could not but involve the essential needs of the most fragile and weakest part of humanity: CHILDREN. Letters

from Missionaries, especially from Sisters, spoke of children suppressed at birth because they were not wanted on account of their sex (girls), their physical or psychic defects or simply because it was impossible to feed them in the great general poverty. The generous and urgent help of everyone was needed to save these creatures destined for death.

This help comes from a great bishop, **Charles August Marie de ForbinJanson** born on 3<sup>rd</sup> November 1785. Entering the seminary of St. Sulpice at an early age his desire and hope was for a missionary life. But this is not to be because Providence decrees that he becomes a seminary rector and Vicar General in Chambery. He realized his missionary dream by becoming a preacher for priests and offering the people 'missions'. Travels and knowledge of peoples normally associated with missionaries also became his direct experience when in 1817 he made a journey to preach in the Middle East, visiting Egypt, Palestine, Syria and Turkey.

Consecrated Bishop of Nancy in 1824, with his missionary zeal Bp. Charles had devotion to the Child Jesus which he never ceased to spread. Mindful of the atrocities that were being perpetrated against children particularly in the gentile world of the age, Bishop Charles gave a mission approach to this devotion. In fact the name itself "Missionary Childhood' expresses his desire to place the Association under the protection of the Child Jesus. He founded the Holy Childhood association on 19<sup>th</sup> May 1843. He was deeply affected by the distress of Chinese children abandoned in the streets. He was convinced that though weak and needing care, children rich in faith and love are capable of playing their own part in the Church's mission- even of stirring adults to show the same generous spirit.

Hence his intuition was to create a movement of Christian children to find the Lord and to save them from death. Its purpose was to save them above all through baptism and to educate them in a Christian manner: all this was to be a fruit of an apostolic and solidarity charity namely of a genuinely missionary spirit and not only a social action.

The children responded and with their prayers and sacrifices began to contest of universal brotherhood which continues helping children of every continent down to our own day. These groups gradually took roots in many places and countries which later on developed as missionary units.

The Association's OBJECTIVES were immediately clear to the Founder and his collaborators.

- ✓ To save a multitude of little children from death...to open Heaven, above all through Baptism, to the largest possible number of these children.
- ✓ To prepare the regeneration of nations by giving children a Christian education.
- ✓ To make these children instruments of salvation as teachers, catechists, doctors, priests and missionaries.

The Bishop's sensitivity gave rise to a new style of mission centered on the grace of Baptism, recognizing the children's right to receive it and their duty to give it.

From the beginning, the Holy Childhood Association was a journey of faith, bringing mission to the heart of children and enabling them to discover the joy of serving their brothers and sisters. The children's missionary spirit was not a one way street. The prayers, sacrifices and love of European children were answered by the prayers, sacrifices, love and sometimes, even martyrdom of children in China. Thanks to the Holy childhood Association, children very soon became active subjects of evangelization.

The slogan "children helping children" caused a Copernican revolution in the apostolate. For the first time children, humble, simple, but also creative and courageous, became protagonists in the pastoral work of the Church.

With considerable self- assurance they succeeded in joining the current of universal solidarity and wrote pages of love that only the Holy Spirit could inspire.

The association grew in the foot-steps of the Saints. In France the charitable chrism of St. Vincent de Paul was very much alive and well organized, and the Holy Childhood Association closely resembled it, though with one substantial difference: the responsibility of bringing less fortunate children to salvation was entrusted to children rather than to adults.

At its founding, Bishop Fayet of Orleans wrote to Bishop De Forbin-Janson: 'There is something in the idea of ransoming Chinese babies that St. Vincent de Paul would have envied. The Church has nothing so tenderly charitable as this'.

The work found favour with individuals and institutions with greater involvement in children's education. Thus it developed rapidly in Europe and North America and its establishment it enjoyed the full support of the Church and the favour of Pope Leo XIII who promoted it with the Encyclical Sancta Dei Civitas (3<sup>rd</sup> December 1880). On 3<sup>rd</sup> May 1922 Pius XII conferred upon it the title 'Pontifical'.

#### ii. Growth and progress:

The first half of the 19<sup>th</sup> century could be called a missionary springtime for the Church in Europe. Thousands of messengers of the Gospel left the Old Continent for faraway lands. French missionaries distinguished themselves by their number and their courage, drawing fresh spiritual enthusiasm from the Charism of the newly established 'Ad Gentes' congregations. At home, the faithful accompanied the missionaries with their constant prayer and financial support, working actively with the Society for the propagation of the Faith, a wonderful way of feeling fully involved in the Church's work of evangelization.

Until then, children had been as recipients of mission and of evangelization. Suddenly they became convinced and resolute protagonists. Bishops and priests were astonished to see children become involved in a mission which placed them at the heart of the Church and the world.

In the Holy Childhood's Foundation, one could see the missionary potential, in which they saw a special working of the Holy Spirit. The Founder himself, as if in a prophesy, spoke of Chinese children as so many new Moseses who having themselves been saved by the prayers and generosity of European children, would in turn save their own brothers and sisters by becoming catechists, teachers, missionaries, fathers and mothers of Christian families. Time has proved him right: from among those children, in fact, came the first Chinese Cardinal and the first Chinese child to be declared a saint.

The missionary involvement of children was certainly a running point in the history of the Church. From salvation History we know that children were never given a role of pastoral responsibility. In the mentality of the Hebrew people children belonged to the category of those "without dignity", and in rabbinical literature children were considered on a par with the mentally deficient and deaf-mutes.

As these small groups grew in works of charity, they began to draw attention of the whole of Europe. Many parishes throughout Europe formed units of these groups among children. This developed in them a sense of love for the poor and the needy children. They began to sacrifice their extra expenses on entertainment, outing, snacks etc., thus saving money for this great purpose. Gradually these associations of children helping children gained support from parents and elders far & wide with a mission orientation.

Before he died at the age of 59, Bishop Charles entrusted this task to Rev. Fr. Ponami who worked strenuously for 6 years to start units of Holy Childhood Society in France and other countries. Rev. Fr. James who succeeded him put in all his efforts for 12 years. Several great personalities used all their talents & strength in order to spread the society throughout the world.

Today there are millions of "little missionaries" distributed throughout parishes, schools and movements of the five continents. Concretely, the Pontifical Society of Missionary childhood proposes to:

- a. Help educators to progressively awaken in children a universal missionary conscience.
- b. Help children to develop their missionary protagonism.
- c. Move children to share their faith and material means, especially with the children of the neediest regions and churches.
- d. Promote missionary vocations.
- e. To be integrated into the overall pastoral program of Christian education, to which it will contribute its missionary projection.

In order to achieve its objectives, Missionary childhood lends two services to children: the first and principal one is missionary education; the second is missionary co-operation with the neediest children and the missions of the whole world.

Therefore, the Pontifical Society of Missionary Childhood or Holy Childhood, which is a Society of the universal church and of the local churches, is animating and forming children (up to 14 years of age) from a missionary viewpoint and their educators so that they will live in ecclesial missionary communion and carry out their local mission and their missionary co-operation with universal evangelization, especially of children.

#### **Projects Receiving Help**

The Holy Childhood Association aims to help the greatest number of children possible. It channels aid to institutions and organizations in the developing world concerned with children below the age of 14. Nurseries and day-care centres, children's Homes, orphanages, primary schools, dispensaries, maternity hospitals, and handicapped centres are among the many beneficiaries of the Society for Missionary/Holy Childhood assistance.

# Benefits of belonging to the Missionary Childhood Association (MCA)

The Missionary Childhood Association membership brings children to God, makes gentle demands of them, counters selfishness and teaches them to pray in an informal and personal way.

- Their families benefit if they are willing to support and share the faith experience of the children and read the Newsletter with them.
- Teachers/Animators benefit spiritually as they endeavour to stimulate the faith and devotion of the children.
- Parishes benefit when the priest and people of the parish support the children in various MCA activities for Advent, Christmas, Lent and the Annual Missionary Childhood Association Day (Second Sunday of February).
- Children in need benefit from the prayers and funds of the MCA.

• The whole Church benefits from the prayers and sacrifices of children. By participating in the MCA, children learn to give voluntarily and this, in turn, prepares them for volunteer action when they are older.

#### Missionary Childhood Association In Schools/Parishes

The MCA can be incorporated into the regular Religious Education program, especially when the lessons speak about the mission of Jesus and His disciples. The MCA can be formed as a children's club in the school, or an activity for an already-existing children's group. The MCA and its work of prayer, learning about others and sharing what we have, could be coupled with activities required to prepare for First Eucharist or Confirmation.

#### Theme: 'Our children are peace-makers'

#### **Preparation:**

- Prepare the children before celebrating the actual day with a week-long activity. Arrange for prayer days, novenas, missionary rosaries (refer the last part of this note) and competitions.
- Give sufficient publicity to the theme of the Missionary Childhood Day (MCA) Celebration 2017 – "Children are ambassadors of peace".
- Explain to the children about the situation of the children worldwide and of the children in socio-economically poor countries. Have "Floats" depicting these "Success Stories" and take it across the cities to create awareness on the Missionary Childhood Day. Combine the MCA Campaign with Christmas... thus extending it right through until MISSIONARY CHILDHOOD DAY. Have a "Raffles Draw" and begin selling tickets around the time of Advent and Missionary childhood Day. Have a GRAND Holy Eucharist Procession with Children's Band across the streets etc. (Liturgy Procession); with HCA children wearing badges and marching by... on the BIG DAY!Make it a WHOLE DAY celebration... with maximum participation... a time of gala and fun and at the same time very much MISSION

- Plan to visit needy persons in the parish Hospitals, home for the aged, children's homes rural exposure to children from the city etc.
- Prepare children for the Eucharistic celebration with appropriate readings and hymns (involvement of the children is very important).
- Prepare well for the procession in the beginning of the Eucharist.
- Animators should remind children to come with the gifts or dumb-boxes which they will offer on the Missionary Childhood Day. <u>Make the children offer their gifts or savings of the</u> year at the offertory in a procession.
- Let the children formulate the prayers of the faithful in their own language.
- You may conduct competitions for singing on "hymns on mission"; Elocution on "I am called to be a saint" and Quiz competition on Religious Congregation(s) in my parish, their founder, charism, history etc.
- Distribute 'dumb boxes' to children to sacrifice part of their pocket money for missions throughout the next year.

#### LITURGY

#### Introduction to the Holy Mass

In the Holy Father's Christmas reflection on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> of December 2015, he invited the faithful gathered in the St. Peter's Square for the last General Audience of 2015 to "look to the lives of children" in order to learn to welcome and love Jesus. God too 'was a child' he said. If we want to welcome and love Jesus we need to look at the lives of children. Children are precious little gift from God to know God. The innocence, tender love and the beauty of a child are a mirror that shows God to the world.

No barrier can be put in between Jesus and children. Any blockade is sin. We recall the words of Jesus 'Let the children come to me and do not hinder them.' (Matt 19.13-15). Children had a special place in the heart of Jesus. In his exhortations he made a number of references to the children ("Unless you become like children you will not enter the Kingdom of God"). Children

are LITTLE MISSIONARIES of the Good News. Let us start to understand and appreciate this fact.

Missionary Childhood Day celebrations remind us the need to bring children closer to Jesus. It is a day to enabling the children to deepen their faith in Jesus and His love for the world. About causing scandals to little children Jesus said 'It would be better for him if a millstone were hung round his neck and he were cast into the sea, than that he should cause one of these little ones to sin (Lk.17.1-2). Today we thank God for all the children of the world for without them the world would be less beautiful. We thank God for our own children who are the best gift for us in our families. Also, we pray for all the children of the world and remind ourselves about our responsibility of making them better human beings and bring closer to Jesus. We have a responsibility to make children MISSIONARIES. Hence, every child should be made member of the Missionary Childhood Association for forming them in faith.

#### **Penitential Rite**

Lord Jesus, you had a special love for the last and the least in your circle of disciples. You loved those who are most neglected. Even though I know that millions of children are suffering due to lack of food, shelter and clothing in the world I have not shown any concern for them. Lord, have Mercy.

#### Lord, have Mercy.

Lord Jesus, in your lifetime, you gave us the best example to love the little ones and you said 'if any one receives a child in my name receives me.' Time and again I have failed to love - hated instead, misbehaved and harshly treated children. For this insensitivity Christ, have Mercy.

#### Christ, have Mercy.

Lord Jesus, you came to gather all the nations into the peace of God's Kingdom. For all the moments that we failed to educate and impart the precious gift of faith to our children by our words and examples, Lord, have Mercy.

#### Lord, have Mercy.

Almighty God of love may have mercy on us, forgive us all our negligence and sinful tendencies and lead us to life everlasting life. Amen

#### 2018 Lenten Message of His Holiness Pope Francis

"Because of the increase of iniquity, the love of many will grow cold" (Mt 24: 12)

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Once again, the Pasch of the Lord draws near! In our preparation for Easter, God in his providence offers us each year the season of Lent as a "sacramental sign of our conversion".[1] Lent summons us, and enables us, to come back to the Lord whole-heartedly and in every aspect of our life. With this message, I would like again this year to help the entire Church experience this time of grace anew, with joy and in truth. I will take my cue from the words of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew: "Because of the increase of iniquity, the love of many will grow cold" (24:12).

These words appear in Christ's preaching about the end of time. They were spoken in Jerusalem, on the Mount of Olives, where the Lord's passion would begin. In reply to a question of the disciples, Jesus foretells a great tribulation and describes a situation in which the community of believers might well find itself: amid great trials, false prophets would lead people astray and the love that is the core of the Gospel would grow cold in the hearts of many.

**False prophets:** Let us listen to the Gospel passage and try to understand the guise such false prophets can assume.

They can appear as "snake charmers", who manipulate human emotions in order to enslave others and lead them where they would have them go. How many of God's children are mesmerized by momentary pleasures, mistaking them for true happiness! How many men and women live entranced by the dream of wealth, which only makes them slaves to profit and petty interests! How many go through life believing that they are sufficient unto themselves, and end up entrapped by loneliness!

False prophets can also be "charlatans", who offer easy and immediate solutions to suffering that soon prove utterly useless. How many young people are taken in by the panacea of drugs, of disposable relationships, of easy but dishonest gains! How many more are ensnared in a thoroughly "virtual" existence, in which relationships appear quick and straightforward, only to prove meaningless! These swindlers, in peddling things that have no real value, rob people of all that is most precious: dignity, freedom and the ability to love. They appeal to our vanity, our trust in appearances, but in the end they only make fools of us. Nor should we be surprised. In order to confound the human heart, the devil,

who is "a liar and the father of lies" (Jn 8:44), has always presented evil as good, falsehood as truth. That is why each of us is called to peer into our heart to see if we are falling prey to the lies of these false prophets. We must learn to look closely, beneath the surface, and to recognize what leaves a good and lasting mark on our hearts, because it comes from God and is truly for our benefit.

A cold heart: In his description of hell, Dante Alighieri pictures the devil seated on a throne of ice,[2] in frozen and loveless isolation. We might well ask ourselves how it happens that charity can turn cold within us. What are the signs that indicate that our love is beginning to cool?

More than anything else, what destroys charity is greed for money, "the root of all evil" (1 Tim 6: 10). The rejection of God and his peace soon follows; we prefer our own desolation rather than the comfort found in his word and the sacraments.[3] All this leads to violence against anyone we think is a threat to our own "certainties": the unborn child, the elderly and infirm, the migrant, the alien among us, or our neighbour who does not live up to our expectations.

Creation itself becomes a silent witness to this cooling of charity. The earth is poisoned by refuse, discarded out of carelessness or for self-interest. The seas, themselves polluted, engulf the remains of countless shipwrecked victims of forced migration. The heavens, which in God's plan, were created to sing his praises, are rent by engines raining down implements of death.

Love can also grow cold in our own communities. In the Apostolic Exhortation Evangelii Gaudium, I sought to describe the most evident signs of this lack of love: selfishness and spiritual sloth, sterile pessimism, the temptation to self-absorption, constant warring among ourselves, and the worldly mentality that makes us concerned only for appearances, and thus lessens our missionary zeal.[4]

#### What are we to do?

Perhaps we see, deep within ourselves and all about us, the signs I have just described. But the Church, our Mother and Teacher, along with the often bitter medicine of the truth, offers us in the Lenten season the soothing remedy of prayer, almsgiving and fasting.

By devoting more time to prayer, we enable our hearts to root out our secret lies and forms of self-deception,[5] and then to find the consolation God offers. He is our Father and he wants us to live life well.

Almsgiving sets us free from greed and helps us to regard our neighbour as a brother or sister. What I possess is never mine alone. How I would like almsgiving to become a genuine style of life for each of us! How I would like us, as Christians, to follow the example of the Apostles and see in the sharing of our possessions a tangible witness of the communion that is ours in the Church! For this reason, I echo Saint Paul's exhortation to the Corinthians to take up a collection for the community of Jerusalem as something from which they themselves would benefit (cf. 2 Cor 8:10). This is all the more fitting during the Lenten season, when many groups take up collections to assist Churches and peoples in need. Yet I would also hope that, even in our daily encounters with those who beg for our assistance, we would see such requests as coming from God himself. When we give alms, we share in God's providential care for each of his children. If through me God helps someone today, will he not tomorrow provide for my own needs? For no one is more generous than God.[6]

Fasting weakens our tendency to violence; it disarms us and becomes an important opportunity for growth. On the one hand, it allows us to experience what the destitute and the starving have to endure. On the other hand, it expresses our own spiritual hunger and thirst for life in God. Fasting wakes us up. It makes us more attentive to God and our neighbour. It revives our desire to obey God, who alone is capable of satisfying our hunger.

I would also like my invitation to extend beyond the bounds of the Catholic Church, and to reach all of you, men and women of good will, who are open to hearing God's voice. Perhaps, like ourselves, you are disturbed by the spread of iniquity in the world, you are concerned about the chill that paralyzes hearts and actions, and you see a weakening in our sense of being members of the one human family. Join us, then, in raising our plea to God, in fasting, and in offering whatever you can to our brothers and sisters in need!

The fire of Easter: Above all, I urge the members of the Church to take up the Lenten journey with enthusiasm, sustained by almsgiving, fasting and prayer. If, at times, the flame of charity seems to die in our own hearts, know that this is never the case in the heart of God! He constantly gives us a chance to begin loving anew.

One such moment of grace will be, again this year, the "24 Hours for the Lord" initiative, which invites the entire Church community to celebrate the sacrament of Reconciliation in the context of Eucharistic adoration. In 2018, inspired by the words

of Psalm 130:4, "With you is forgiveness", this will take place from Friday, 9 March to Saturday, 10 March. In each diocese, at least one church will remain open for twenty-four consecutive hours, offering an opportunity for both Eucharistic adoration and sacramental confession.

During the Easter Vigil, we will celebrate once more the moving rite of the lighting of the Easter candle. Drawn from the "new fire", this light will slowly overcome the darkness and illuminate the liturgical assembly. "May the light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds",[7] and enable all of us to relive the experience of the disciples on the way to Emmaus. By listening to God's word and drawing nourishment from the table of the Eucharist, may our hearts be ever more ardent in faith, hope and love.

With affection and the promise of my prayers for all of you, I send you my blessing. Please do not forget to pray for me.
